## **CONSERVATION CORNER...**

Well, folks, it's time to fight! Bear with me and I'll tell you why...but first, a question. DID YOU KNOW there is such a thing as the NATIONAL TRAILS SYSTEM ACT? And that Congress in 1978 allocated \$90 million for land acquisitions to provide permanent protection for our beloved Appalachian Trail?

Well, 'tis true. BUT, one little flaw is that the actual amount to be spent each year must be approved by the Congress.

So, here's the problem...for fiscal year 1986, the President has allowed for ZERO \$ for AT land buys, and has asked for a 3-yr. moratorium on all Federal land acquisitions. But AT Committee officials have protested by requesting \$9.3 million for the Natl. Park Service and \$700,000 for the Forest Service, so Congress has been busy with eharings since May. That's where we come in!

AMC-ers owe it to ourselves to voice our opinions on the matter to our legislators NOW! If the AT acquistion project is not funded, there's a chance that we'll be left with disjointed sections of the Trail.
